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Dear Parent/Guardian

Your child is now due their **Meningococcal ACWY vaccination** and their **Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Polio (Teenage 3 in 1 Booster)** vaccination. These vaccines are offered to all students in Year 9 and will be given in school. These are part of the childhood immunisation programme.

### Why get your child vaccinated?

- **Meningococcal ACWY** – protects your son/daughter against four types of meningococcal bacteria (Types A, C, W and Y) that cause meningitis (inflammation of the brain lining) and septicaemia (blood poisoning). We strongly urge you to take this opportunity to protect your son/daughter against these four infections which, as you will be aware, can kill or have serious life-long consequences.
- **The 3 in 1 booster** – protects your son/daughter against Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Polio, all of which can be very serious diseases. This is a booster for the vaccinations your son/daughter received as a baby, and then again at approximately 3-4 years (the preschool booster).
