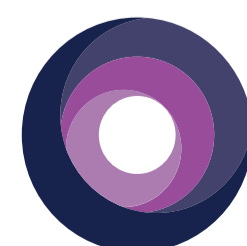

PE KIT

Our PE Kit consists of:

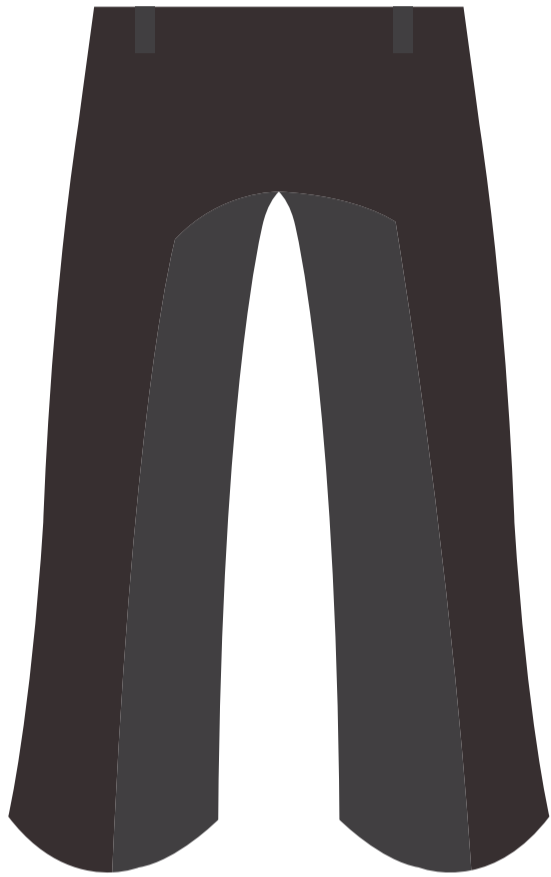
- Short Sleeve Crew Neck Shirt*
- Short Sleeve Polo Shirt*
- Long Sleeve Sports Jersey*
- Black Sports Jacket*
- Black Tracksuit Bottoms, Shorts or Skort
- Sports Shoes or Trainers
- Sports socks* or Plain Black Socks

Our uniform and sports kit have recently been updated. All new uniform purchased will display the new academy logo and newly purchased PE kit has the Sutton Storm logo.

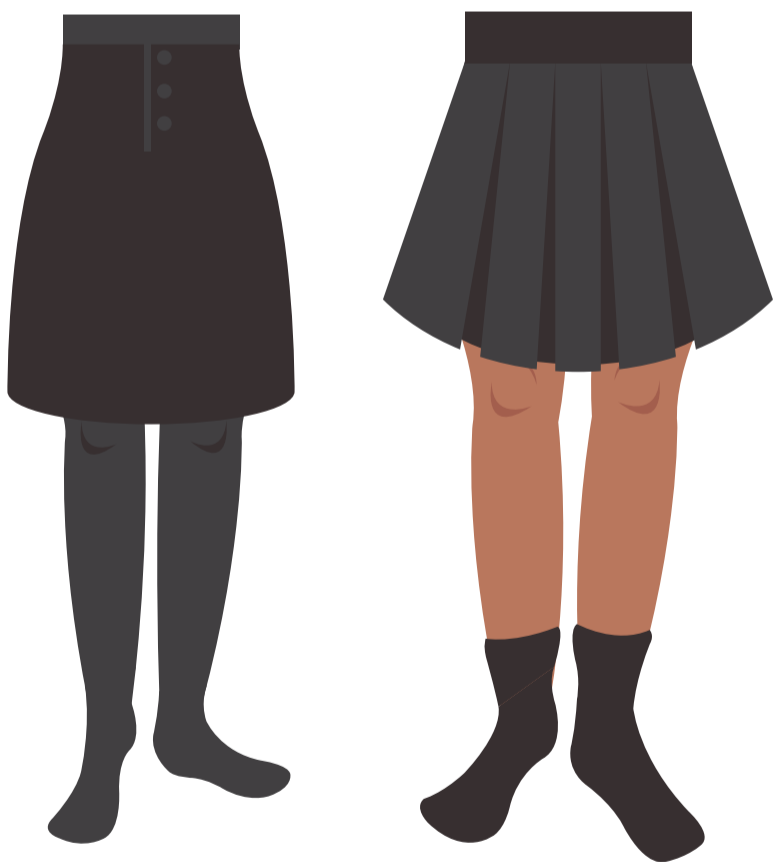
We understand that your child may already have old uniform and/or kit from previous years, or inherited from a sibling. If you would prefer not to purchase new uniform for them at this time, your child will still be permitted to wear uniform that displays the old logo throughout the next academic year.



TROUSERS & SKIRTS



If you choose to wear trousers, we ask that these are of a conventional material and style. Jeans and leggings are comfy, but not appropriate for school. Skinny trousers and skintight stretchy leggings don't look professional, so we ask you not to wear these; a straight leg style would be best.

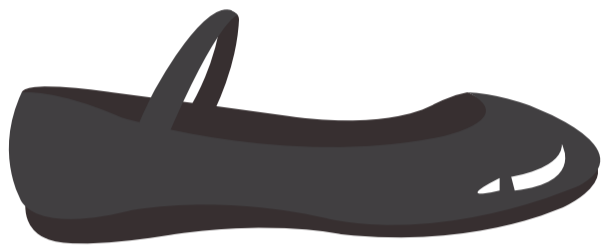


If you choose to wear a skirt to school, it must be at least knee length. This means that the hem of the skirt should reach your knee cap.

Tights worn with skirts should be plain black, or match your skin tone. You'll have to save the funky coloured ones for home.

We ask that, for consistency, all trousers and skirts are black, not grey.

SHOES & SOCKS



School uniform is meant to keep you looking smart and professional, so you'll need some smart, professional looking shoes to go with it.

We ask that all shoes are flat, black, unbranded, and made of a plain polishable material. They should be comfortable and suitable for walking in all weathers.

The style of shoe you choose is up to you, as long as it fits these requirements. Lace-up, velcro and buckled shoes are all okay for school.

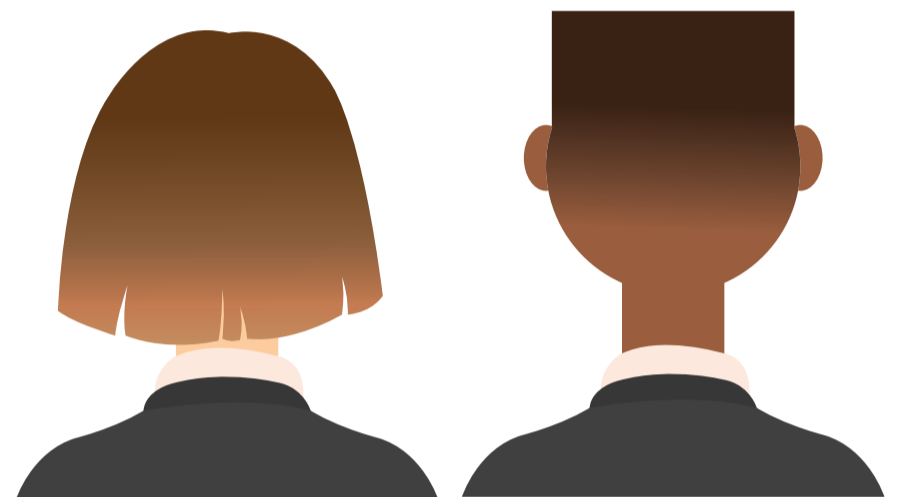
Boots, trainers, canvas shoes and high-heels don't fit into our uniform requirements.

You can wear trainers in your PE lessons, but not for the rest of your classes, or for walking around the academy.

Shoes with heels can be impractical and unsafe for school, so we request that you wear flat shoes only.

Boots are excellent to keep your feet warm in winter, but if you want to wear them to walk to and from school, you'll have to bring school shoes with you to wear during the day.

HAIR & ACCESSORIES



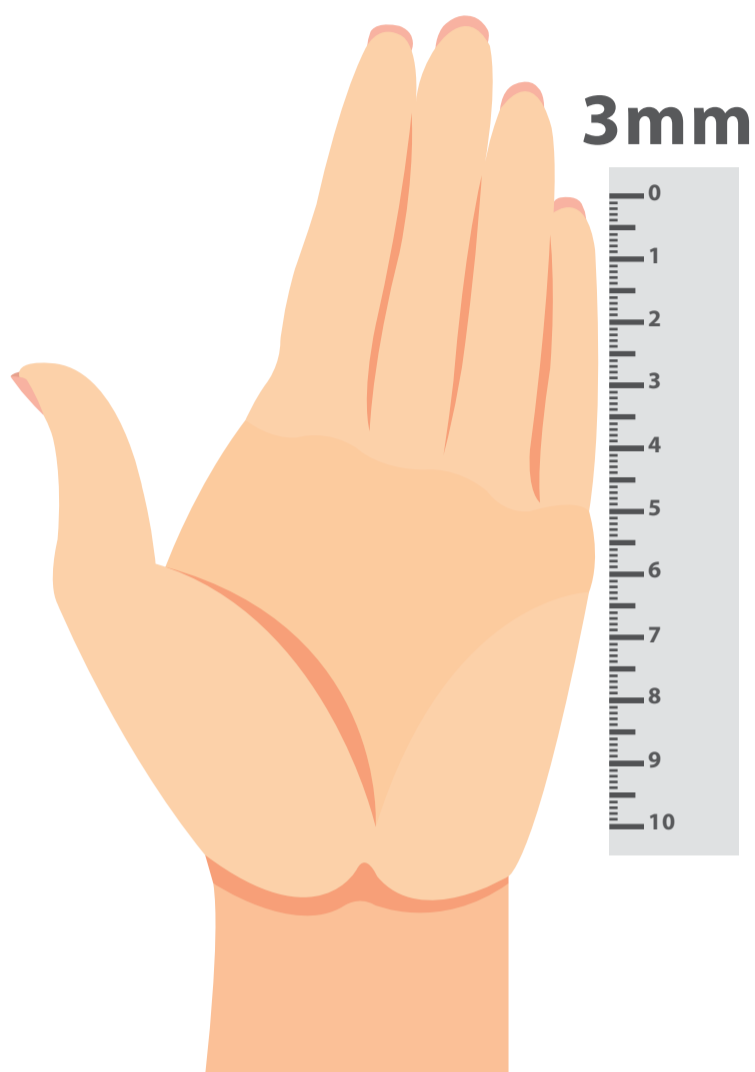
Jewellery can be pretty and a fun way to express yourself, but it's not all appropriate for school. It can get lost easily and can be dangerous when you're doing practical subjects.

Because of this, we ask that if you'd like to wear jewellery, you limit it to one small set of stud earrings and a watch. You can also wear a medical bracelet if you need one.

All students and staff have to dress smartly and professionally to come to school. That's why we ask you to style your hair in a neat, natural way, and keep it a natural colour.

If you want to wear makeup, we ask you to keep it discreet and natural looking, or we might need to ask you to remove it.

FINGERNAILS



Your fingernails should be no longer than 3mm from the end of your finger.

If they are longer than this, we might ask you to trim them. This is because long nails can be dangerous to you and to others. They are unsafe for participating in sports, DT and other practical activities.

If you have long fake nails, we'll ask you to remove them.



We all need to look smart and professional for school- this includes keeping your nails neat and clean. Chipped varnish and missing acrylics don't look smart at all.

If you'd like to wear nail polish, we ask you to keep it to a single colour in a neutral tone.



If there is any debate about what is considered appropriate for school, the principal will have the ultimate decision.
