Uniform

Our uniform is supplied by Uniform Direct. The details for this supplier can be found via the leaflet in the admissions pack, or via our website.

Our uniform consists of:

- Black Academy blazer*
- White button-up shirt
- Academy tie*
- Black trousers or skirt
- Black socks or tights
- Black, flat, polishable shoes



Shoes and shirts can be sourced from elsewhere. All shoes should be of a plain polishable material, suitable for walking in all weathers, and worn with black socks or tights. The white shirt should be of a conventional material, worn buttoned to the collar and tucked in at all times.

Blazers should be worn on arrival to the academy in the morning and the sleeves should always be rolled down.

Plain black jumpers can be worn underneath your blazer, but should not be worn instead of a blazer. No logos are allowed unless the official SCA jumper.

Trousers & Skirts

If you choose to wear trousers, we ask that these are of a conventional material and style. Jeans and leggings are comfy, but not appropriate for school. Skinny trousers and skintight stretchy leggings do not look professional, so we ask you not to wear these; a straight leg style would be best.



If you choose to wear a skirt to school, skirts must be lower than the bottom of the blazer. This means that the hem of the skirt should reach your knee cap.



Tights worn with skirts should be plain black or match your skin tone. You'll have to save the funky coloured ones for home!

We ask that, for consistency, all trousers and skirts are black, not grey.



If there is any debate about what is considered appropriate for school, the Principal will have the ultimate decision.



Socks & Shoes

School uniform is meant to keep you looking smart and professional, so you'll need some smart, professional looking shoes to go with it.



We ask that all shoes are flat, black, unbranded, and made of a plain polishable material. They should be comfortable and suitable for walking in all weathers.



The style of shoe you choose is up to you, as long as it fits these requirements. Lace-up, Velcro and buckled shoes are all okay for school.

Boots, trainers, canvas shoes and high-heels do not fit our uniform requirements.



You can wear trainers in your PE lessons, but not for the rest of your classes, or for walking around the academy.

Shoes with heels can be impractical and unsafe for school, so we request that you wear flat shoes only.



Socks & Shoes

Boots are excellent to keep your feet warm in winter, but if you want to wear them to walk to and from school, you'll have to bring school shoes with you to wear during the day.

Faith & Culture

Faith-based accessories are permitted to be worn with the school uniform, as long as they do not breach health and safety regulations. We encourage students to express their beliefs while maintaining a safe and respectful environment

Hair & Accessories

Jewellery can be pretty and a fun way to express yourself, but it's not all appropriate for school. It can get lost easily and can be dangerous when you're doing practical subjects.



Because of this, we ask that if you'd like to wear jewellery is limited to 2 studs in each ear, 1 watch, 1 bracelet, 1 ring and 1 nose stud. You can also wear a medical bracelet if you need one.



All students and staff have to dress smartly and professionally to come to school. That's why we ask you to cut and style your hair in a neat, natural way, and keep it one natural colour. If we think your haircut is inappropriate, we might ask you to change it.



If you want to wear makeup, we ask you to keep it discreet and natural looking, or we might need to ask you to remove it.

Fingernails

Your fingernails should be no longer than 3mm from the end of your finger, including acrylics.

If they are longer than this, we might ask you to trim them.

This is because long nails can be dangerous to you and to others. They are unsafe for participating in sports, DT and other practical activities.

If you have long fake nails, we'll ask you to remove them.

We all need to look smart and professional for school- this includes keeping your nails neat and clean. Chipped varnish and missing acrylics don't look smart at all.

If you'd like to wear nail polish, we ask you to keep it to a single colour in a neutral tone.

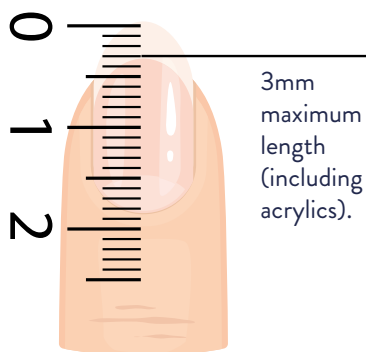
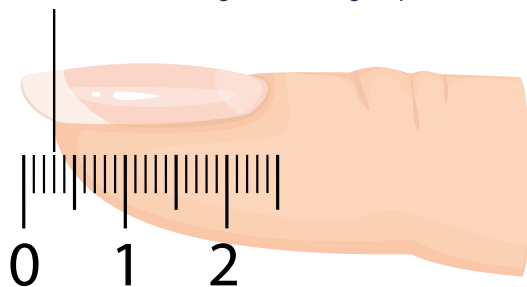
