Personal Development

This year has been full of opportunity and excitement as we continued to support our students in exploring future career paths and celebrating their achievements.

Year 10 students took part in a week-long work experience, followed by our popular Mock Interview Day. Local employers kindly volunteered their time to give students a taste of real-life interviews—an invaluable experience in building confidence and preparing for their next steps.

Year 9 explored the world of apprenticeships through our *Get Into Apprenticeships* event, discovering a range of pathways to success. Meanwhile, **Year 8** delved into the tech industry thanks to our exciting partnership with *Innovate Her*, which introduced them to careers in technology and digital innovation.

Through the **Aspiring Ashfield** initiative, our students benefitted from unique experiences including a visit to *ITP Aero*, the *Reach For the Stars Careers in STEM* event, and the chance to connect with inspiring local businesses.

Our **reward programme** also blossomed this year with the expansion of the *ClassCharts Reward Shop*, offering students meaningful experiences such as landscape photography, sports activities, and a picnic day. Smaller treats like ice pops and water bottles added to the fun.

To celebrate **positive behaviour and excellent attendance**, students enjoyed a range of treats—from hot chocolate and Easter goodies to a magical trip to *Sherwood Observatory and Planetarium*. And of course, the *Twelve Days of Christmas Rewards* brought joyful cheer to the end of the first term.

We're proud of everything our students have achieved this year and look forward to even more success and inspiration ahead!

Behaviour and Standards

Our students continue to be role models and a credit to themselves, their families, SCA and the wider community. External visitors comment on the positive atmosphere, unfailing politeness, smart uniform and exemplary conduct of our students. SCA students have earned a record number of positive points this year -234,000-24% higher than last year. Especially pleasing is the 79% increase in positive points under the "Worked Hard" category showing excellent student commitment to their lessons. The rewards programme recognises these contributions to academy life and continues to go from strength to strength. Students have been able to enjoy movie afternoons, afternoon tea, a visit

to the Observatory, reading afternoons and even an ice pop to keep them cool in the recent heatwaves, to name a few examples of how we acknowledge and thank students for their conduct.

We know that positive behaviour and high standards lead to improved outcomes for our young people and we thank you for your continued support in this vital element of academy life.

We continue to be very proud of all our students who have received reading intervention this year and the magnificent levels of progress that students have made. Many students have graduated the programme this year with reading ages that are above their chronological age. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have been involved in our Buddy reading programme this year where sixth form students have listened to younger students read. All involved have said what an enjoyable and helpful experience this has been, and we look forward to extending this programme in the new academic year.

Please can I encourage you to continue to read at home during the summer break, even if it is only 10 minutes each day, to maintain confidence and enjoyment in reading. The school library has plenty of books to choose from along with the ePlatform which can be accessed via a mobile device or tablet. We look forward to hearing what you have read when we return to the academy.

It was great to see Year 7 students working with the author Darren Simpson this half term and discussing his work and getting the opportunity to read section of his book 'The Memory Thieves.'
